#### A Note for the Church

**Let's get into it**—because faithfulness isn't about age, but about a love that won't let go.

## **Agape-Shaped Faithfulness**

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love...faithfulness." — Galatians 5:22

Faithfulness (*pistis*) isn't just about being good or ticking religious boxes—it's about relationship. It's what happens when God's love changes us from the inside out. In Galatians 5:22, Paul isn't listing separate "fruits" like a spiritual shopping list. It's one fruit with different flavours—like a single apple with sweetness, crispness, and juiciness all working together. The core flavour? *Agape* love—the kind that sticks around no matter what. Everything else (joy, peace, patience—even faithfulness) flows from that.

So, what exactly is this "faithfulness"? It's agape love that doesn't quit. Love that stays loyal when things get tough, when feelings fade, or when no one's watching. The Greek word pistis comes from peithō ("to persuade")—which tells us something cool: Real faithfulness starts with God persuading us He's trustworthy. It's like when a mate consistently has your back until you know they're reliable—that's God with us. But then it changes us too, making us more dependable in return. Some Bibles translate it as "faith" (KJV), others "faithfulness" (NIV)—because it's both: trusting God and becoming someone, others can trust.

This isn't flashy stuff. *Agape*-shaped faithfulness is what keeps you praying when it feels pointless, forgiving others when you'd rather not, and showing up when it's inconvenient. It's not a one-off grand gesture but a daily, quiet consistency—like a candle that won't blow out. In a world where everything shifts (relationships, trends, even your feelings), this kind of faithfulness anchors you.

Living this way means moving to the Spirit's rhythm:

- 1. Letting God convince you He's reliable (peithō—that persuasion bit)
- 2. Being reshaped by His no-strings-attached love (agape)
- 3. Paying it forward through steady, no-drama loyalty

This week we're exploring how this works in real life—how God's stubborn love makes us people who keep our word, stay true, and reflect Him even when it's hard. Ready to dig in?

Galatians 5:22; Deuteronomy 7:9

...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy...faithfulness..." — Galatians 5:22 (BSB)

"Know therefore that the LORD your God is God, the faithful God who keeps His covenant of loving devotion for a thousand generations of those who love Him and keep His commandments." — Deuteronomy 7:9 (BSB)



Before faithfulness shows up in our lives, it starts with God convincing us—not with arguments, but with His rock-solid track

Deuteronomy 7:9 doesn't say "Just believe harder!" It says, "Know therefore" like when you've seen enough proof to trust someone completely. God is like that mate who's always kept their word:

- Not just "able" but committed He doesn't bail when it gets messy (covenantal, not just capable).
- Not a flash-in-the-pan love His loyalty outlasts generations (your grandparents' God is still your God).
- Not moody No "off days" with Him (same yesterday, today, forever).

That's pistis (the "faithfulness" in Galatians 5:22) in action. The word comes from peithō—meaning "to persuade." God isn't asking for blind faith; He's saying:

"Look at what I've done. Listen to stories of My faithfulness. Then let that truth sink in until you know I'm trustworthy."

Faithfulness isn't a character trait we strive to develop; it's a divine persuasion we open our heart to receive.



Father God, today I'm choosing to trust You—not because I have all the answers, but because You do. Help me to:

See the ways You've been faithful before (even when I didn't notice).

Remember that You're the same God today as You were for insert [Abraham/my parents/that story in Scripture].

I have stopped trying to 'figure it all out' and just know—deep down—that You're reliable. When doubts creep in, pull me back to this truth: You've never broken a promise vet. Amen.

## Faithfulness = Trusting What God Says

Romans 4:19-21

"He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead... No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, fully convinced that God was able to do what He had promised." (ESV)



Yesterday we saw that real faithfulness starts with knowing who God is. Today's lesson? It's about staking your life on what God says—even when it sounds crazy. **Enter Abraham:** 

- **Promise:** 100 years old + barren wife = baby? Yeah, right!
- Reality check: Every biological fact screamed "IMPOSSIBLE!"
- **But...** "He grew strong in his faith, totally convinced God would do what He promised" (Romans 4:20-21).

**Key phrase:** "Fully convinced" (Greek: plērophoreō). This isn't blind optimism—it's **unshakeable trust** built on:

- 1. **God's covenant** (God had cut a covenant with Abraham before)
- God's character (He doesn't lie or forget)

Abraham's faith wasn't a passive "hope so"—it was an active "know so" that made him **keep walking, waiting, and obeying** for 25 years. That's agape-shaped faithfulness: **love that sticks to God's word like glue**, even when life looks nothing like the promise.

**Our turn:** God's promises to *us* can sound just as wild: "Peace in chaos?" | "Strength when I'm exhausted?" | "Life after death?" Faithfulness means responding like Abraham: not with "But how?" but with "I know You've got this."

Father God, I'm holding onto Your promises—even when they seem wild right now. Like Abraham, I choose to:

- ✓ Trust Your timing (even if it takes 25 years... ugh).
- Focus on Who said it, not how impossible it looks.
- Keep walking forward, even when I can't see the next step.

When my brain screams 'This makes no sense!', shout louder: 'I've got this.' Amen.



# Faithfulness is Built in the Small Stuff

Luke 16:10 & Matthew 25:21



# The Parable of the Talents Remix:

- The boss didn't care about how much profit his team made
- He cared about *how they handled* what they'd been given
- The guy with two coins got the same praise as the guy with five, suggesting that effort is valued as much as, if not more than, results.

## This changes everything:

- Your "boring" daily choices (honesty when no one's watching, patience with annoying siblings) are your faithfulness CV
- God's not waiting for you to go viral—He's watching how you handle the ordinary

# Agape-shaped faithfulness looks like:

- ✓ Showing up when you don't feel like it
- √ Doing the right thing when it costs you
- √ Staying kind even when you're tired

# Feeling unrecognised? Good news:

- God sees every unnoticed act of loyalty
- The "small" stuff is actually your training ground
- Want God to trust you with more? Nail the little things first

You see every single faithful choice I make

## Real Faithfulness Happens Off-Camera

Matthew 6:3-4 & 2 Chronicles 16:9



Let's be real – anyone can put on a show when they've got an audience. But the real test? What you do when:

√ No one's watching

√ No one's clapping

√ No one's gonna find out

Jesus called this the "secret stuff" (Matthew 6:4, MSG version). He said:

- "When you pray... go low-key"
- "When you help others... don't post about it"
- "When you fast... keep it between you and God"

Why? Because God's the only audience that actually matters.

# Spotlight on Two Legends:

- 1 Daniel Kept praying even when it meant death-by-lions (no Instagram stories, just raw faith)
- 2 Joseph Said no to temptation when it would've been easier to say yes (and *nobody* was around to see it)

Here's the truth:

- Your *private* prayer time? That's your power source.
- That kind act you didn't post about? That's real gold.
- That temptation you walked away from? That's next-level strength.

# Feeling unseen? That's your superpower.

God's building your faithfulness muscle in the shadows – so when your moment comes, you'll be unshakeable.

# Mirroring God's faithfulness in Relationships

Proverbs 28:20 & Proverbs 3:3

"A faithful man will abound with blessings, but one eager to be rich will not go unpunished." Proverbs 28:20 (BSB)

"Never let loving devotion or faithfulness leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart." Proverbs 3:3 (BSB)

Let's cut to the chase: real faithfulness isn't just a "you and God" thing—it's how you show up for others when it matters. In a world where ghosting, half-truths and fair-weather friends are the norm, being actually dependable is revolutionary.

#### God-Level Faithfulness Looks Like:

- Keeping promises Even when you're tired/bored/annoyed
- ▼ Telling the truth Especially when lying would save your skin.
- Sticking around Not just when it's fun, but when it's hard
- Praying for people Even if they'll never know you did
- Letting go of grudges Because God's done it for you 100x over This isn't about being perfect—it's about mirroring God's no-matter-what love (the kind that stuck with us even when we messed up).

#### Why Bother?

- Proverbs says faithful people "radiate blessings" because trust is the glue that holds relationships together
- You become someone's safe place in a chaotic world
- It's how ordinary people reveal an extraordinary God

Turn my relationships into reflections of Your never-give-up love. Amen.

🌋 Action Point: Contact one person you've been neglecting and schedule time to reconnect. If needed, have an honest conversation to restore trust.



#### Faithfulness in the Fire

1 Corinthians 4:1-2 & 2 Corinthians 4:8-9

Now it is required of stewards that they be found faithful.—1 Corinthians 4:2 (BSB)

"We are hard pressed on all sides, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed."—2 Corinthians 4:8–9 (BSB)



Let's be honest – anyone can talk big when life's easy. But **real faithfulness shows up in the fire** – literally.

Shadrach & Co. faced a furnace and said: "Even if God doesn't rescue us – no regrets" (Daniel 3:16-18)

♦ Job lost everything and still worshipped: "God gives, God takes – blessed be God" (Job 1:20-21)

Jesus stayed faithful all the way to the cross (Hebrews 12:2)

#### This is next-level faithfulness:

- When saying "no" to compromise costs you
- When worship comes through tears
- When you stand alone and get mocked for it

Paul called it "pressed but not crushed" (2 Corinthians 4:8-9).

Translation? Faithfulness isn't about never struggling – it's about refusing to quit in the struggle.

#### Why It Matters:

- 1 Pressure doesn't break faith it *proves* faith
- 2 God's silence is not God's absence (He was *in* the furnace with them)
- 3 Your hardest season might be your most powerful testimony

Pressure doesn't break you—it shows the strength within you as you walk with God.

- ? Perplexed Anchor me to what I know about You
- Persecuted Be my unshakable defender

Like the furnace crew, I'm declaring:

"Even if You don't rescue me - no regrets!" Give me backbone, not bailouts. Amen.

# Faithfulness That Responds - Pausing to Reflect and Obey

"Be doers of the word, and not hearers only." —  ${f James~1:22}$ 

The one who is faithful in little things is also faithful in much. Luke 16:10a (BSB)

This week, we've explored **agape-shaped faithfulness**—how God's relentless love fuels our trust, steadies us in trials, and calls us to show up for others. Now, it's **response time**.

#### **Kairos Moment:**

What stuck with you? Maybe:

- A nudge about half-hearted habits (like skipping prayer)?
- A call to stand firm in a tough situation?
- A challenge to **repair a relationship** you've neglected?

Don't just *agree—act*. Faithfulness isn't grown in theory, but in **daily, practical obedience**.

#### Your Move:

- Feeling convicted? **Start small** (e.g., 5 minutes with Scripture).
- Wrestling with doubt? Name it and bring it to God (He can handle it).
- Tempted to quit? **Text someone to pray for you today.**
